Relatives in Poland—How to Communicate with Them Explained by Immigrant Aid Society.

Important and timely information has just been received by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society of America from its agency in Copenhagen, Denmark, which is of particular interest to those who have relatives in those Polish provinces which have been captured by Germany. The Society is advised that letters to these places should be written in German and should be brief; the addresses should be written in English characters, and the envelope should be marked via Danish Steamers;” the letters should be registered. These letters will then be sent through Denmark to their destinations.

Letters not marked as indicated are often mailed on Russian steamers, and it is extremely doubtful if they ever reach the persons for whom they are intended, as the Russian Government cannot forward mail to provinces captured by the enemy.

The Society therefore urges those who communicate with their relatives in this territory to follow these instructions explicitly to insure the delivery of their letters.
