Dear Friends,

Your kind and gracious letter has just arrived. We feel deeply complimented that you should have taken the trouble to write in your own hand and so exhaustively. Indeed, your handwriting is becoming almost legible; I can read it nearly as fluently as my own.

We are so happy to know that you are looking back with pleasure upon the glorious days we had spent together at Marienbad. They will linger in our memory and we shall be living in the hope of meeting you a year hence or earlier, God willing, either in Marienbad or in any other place. If for any reason whatever you and your dear wife will be unable to come here, we shall certainly visit you in Kopenhagen. We have been looking forward to that event for many years and I earnestly pray that you both may be spared in the best of health and spirits, so that our reunion may be a happy one.

We have missed you at every turn; indeed, we no longer care to go up to Egerländer, since you are not there to keep us company. However, we speak of you constantly and always with much love and yearning. Every one is asking for you and they all seem to realize that something really vital and significant has gone out of their lives with your departure.

Of course I shall do what I can upon my return home at the end of september with respect to securing the cooperation of one of our influential leaders in the matter of the Schechita Problem. Unfortunately, owing to the holidays, most of the important people will be unavailable until late in October. In my judgment, it suffices to interest Louis Marshall, in his capacity as the head of the American Jewish Committee. He will undoubtedly confer with Cyrus Adler and other leaders and I shall do whatever I can, as promptly as possible, to obtain the necessary action which may bring about the result you look for.

Please let us know the address of your young nephew in Philadelphia so that we may introduce him to some of our friends in that city. We are not forgetting our promise to do something on behalf of your friends, the Kaplans in Buffalo.

We leave here at the end of this week for Baden-Baden, stopping over at Nuernberg for one day or two . Our address until September the 10th will be c/o Hotel Stephanie, Baden-Baden; after that c/o The Equitable Trust Co., 41, Rue Cambon, Paris, France. As you know we sail for home on September the 17th.

Mrs. Kohut as well as Dr. Damask join me in sending our loving greetings. May God in His loving kindness and mercy watch over you both well.
