INTRODUCTION TO COPENHAGEN UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

(CUL)

As a foreign student at the University of Copenhagen you can use the Royal Library during your stay in Denmark.

The Royal Library is university library for the University of Copenhagen and the National Library of Denmark

You will find Copenhagen University Library at four locations

- CUL City: Fiolstræde 1. Faculty Library for Social Sciences.
- CUL South: Njalsgade 80, Amager. Faculty Library for the Humanities.
- CUL North: Nørre Allé 49. Faculty Library for Natural and Health Sciences.
- The Royal Library: Søren Kierkegaards Plads 1, Slotsholmen.

This building houses Denmark's National Library and serves the University library with reading rooms and special collections.

How to become a member of the Library

Borrowing books from the library is free of charge, and you register as a new user at the home page

Show your Student ID card the first time you visit the library to pick up books.

IT facilities

As a borrower you have access to the computers in the library and wireless access with your laptop. The public computers give access to the Internet and to a number of relevant programs.

Ordering books and journals and using the material

As soon as you have signed up as a new user, you can find all books and journals in the online catalogue REX and you find all electronic resources (articles, bibliographies etc) in E-resources.

Remote access

Students at the University of Copenhagen have remote access to e-books, e-journals and databases in the collections.

Lending conditions

The lending period is normally one month at a time. You can renew your loan in Rex if the book is not reserved by other users, and the maximum loan period is three months.

Material from the national collections can only be used in Reading Room West at The Royal Library at Slotsholmen.

Copy card

A special copy and print card can be purchased at all four addresses. The price for the card is DKK 25. Money can then be transferred via Dankort or international credit cards (Mastercard, Maestro, Visa, Visa Electron, JCB) to the special card.

In the library building in Fiolstræde you will find:

- Books on open shelves:
Sociology, Economics, Political Science and Law from 1980 onwards.
Anthropology published since 1995 and Psychology after 2005
- Printed periodicals since 1950
- Access to computers and wireless internet access for laptops.
- Information desk and a lending desk
- About 100 study places

How to find books and journals in Fiolstræde

1: Find the book or journal in REX or

2: browse the shelves.

1: Shelfmark "Fiolstræde: Udlånssamling"

indicates that you can find the material on the shelves.

The printed journals are placed in alphabetical order.

If the material is available at "Amager: Udlånssamling" or "Nørre Allé: Udlånssamling", you can ALWAYS make a Request in REX, or go to the location. "Magasin" indicates that the book is in a closed stack and must be ordered in REX.

The material is ready the next weekday after 2 p.m., and will be available for 8 days.

If it is out of the library, make a request, and you will receive a message by mail when it is available.

2: Browse the shelves. The books are placed by subjects and topics

The University Library Fiolstræde on Frue Plads was inaugurated on 1. November 1861.

The master builder of the library was the architect Johan Daniel Herholdt (1818-1902).

The library is built in the Gothic style, influenced by Italian brick architecture and modelled on buildings in Verona particular:

The building underwent a major restoration in 1996 and 1997 planned and led by Royal Surveyor David Bretton-Meyer

As a result of all the installations and furnishing the library has taken a significant step forward to this century, and even if all the computer monitors are turned on, one still has a complete feeling of standing in the building as it was created by Herholdt based on the new ideas of his time
